2. Competition Procedure

There will be two competition formats: **VIRTUAL** and **PHYSICAL**. These two formats are independent.

VIRTUAL: The virtual format will be opened to candidates from all around the world and submission of repertoires is entirely online. There is only **ONE round of competition**. The competition is conducted **through video submission and screening**. Candidates who registered for virtual format are not required to compete in the physical format.

2.1 Video Submission Requirements:

• Format : must be in mp4 or mov file to upload

• Links : links must be generated via a YouTube, Google Drive or Tencent

Video (腾讯视频) URL and must be ready upon registration

• Layout : Landscape Mode - include every contestant / performer (including

the accompanist) throughout the whole video

• Quality : 1920 X 1080 FHD - It is the candidate's responsibility to create and

upload clear and audible video recordings.

• Pieces : 2 pieces are recorded separately, and any form of video editing on

submissions are strictly prohibited.

Validity of Video Uploaded: <u>NO more than 3 months prior</u> to the candidate's registration date.



2.2 PDF Repertoires submission:

- Candidates are required to submit the name of the composer, title and duration of each piece upon registration.
- Candidates are required to submit a PDF file of the repertoire (FULL SCORE), which must be from a published hard copy, during the registration process. All PDF files must be clearly labelled with the following guidelines:
- 1. All other categories: Name_Format & Instrument_Category Joined e.g, M. Tan_Virtual Piano_Category A
- For Ensemble: Ensemble Group Name_Format & Instrument_Category Joined E.g, M. Tan_Virtual String Duet_Category Q
- If unable to submit upon registration, please indicate <u>"Date of submission"</u> e.g. 1st January 2025 and email to <u>ask@musicsingapore.com.sq</u>

Vocal Arrangement: SATB or SSA/TTBB. Modest a cappella sections are encouraged.

Duration: 3–5 minutes per piece. Maximum 12 minutes for both pieces.

Accompaniment: Piano or minimal percussion allowed.

Category T: THREE choices from each of the following:

- One Renaissance or Baroque sacred work (a cappella).
- One contemporary choral piece by a living composer.
- One traditional folk song or cultural piece with complex harmonies.
- One free-choice piece from any genre.

Vocal Arrangement: SATB, SSAATTBB, or more advanced configurations. A cappella strongly encouraged.

Duration: Each piece should not exceed 6 minutes. Maximum 18 minutes in total.

Accompaniment: Limited or no accompaniment preferred.

6. Eligibility: (Open Solo & Exam Graded Categories)

6.1 Age Consideration

For candidates who are aged 18 years and below, the parent or legal guardian of the candidates must give consent to the candidates who are participating in this competition.

Actual birthday and month to be taken into consideration with reference to the deadline of our competition registration date which is on 31st March 2025.

6.2 Videos used for performance graded exams **WILL NOT** be accepted. Please follow our video requirements when recording.



- 6.3 Performance from memory is encouraged, but this is an **optional**. No additional marks will be awarded.
- 6.4 Participants who require sheet music must use original copies. Candidates who want to play with the score are required to show the original book in your video submission.
- 6.5 Violin/Cello/Flute candidates are expected to arrange for their own piano accompanists or enquire about hiring a piano accompanist with the organiser at ask@musicsingapore.com.sg. Piano accompanists provided by the organiser are chargeable and available on a first come first serve basis. No backing soundtrack is allowed in this competition.

7. Eligibility: (Voice)

- 7.1.No backing soundtracks allowed. No amplification allowed. Please switch the video recording to record surrounding sound and not use any special microphones.
- 7.2 Candidates are expected to arrange for their own piano accompanist. Please read Clause 6.5.
- 7.3 Candidates selecting opera arias are required to perform them in the original key and language, and they must be sung from memory.

8. Eligibility (Ensemble Category)

- 8.1 The choir performance can include the use of the piano and/or small percussion instruments only. It can also be unaccompanied (a cappella). The recording should take place in a well-acoustic recital hall with a piano. No amplification for the singers & instrumentalists.
- 8.2 Only **LIVE ACCOMPANIMENTS** and **ORIGINAL SCORES** are permitted. The use of any kind of playback or soundtrack is strictly prohibited.
- 8.3 Candidates are required to submit the name of the composer, the title of the repertoires and duration of their submissions upon registration.
- 8.4 Candidates should choose a repertoire that can showcase their artistry and technical skills, the jury will also take into consideration the difficulty of the selected repertoires.
- 8.5 All participating Ensemble groups are responsible for honouring the copyright and performance rights of the songs sung for the virtual competition. The use of unauthorised/reproduced/ No copyrighted copies is strictly prohibited.
- 8.6 Each individual ensemble member will receive an E-Certificate of participation. Only ONE group award certificate and ONE comment sheet will be issued for the entire group.



9. Competition Prizes

- 9.1. Every candidate who submits accurate details as per the requirements outlined in the competition's Rules & Regulations will be awarded an e-Certificate of Participation and valuable feedback on their submission in the form of judges' digital comment sheets.
- 9.2 Honourable Mention Certificates will be awarded to outstanding performers at the discretion of the judges.
- 9.3 E-certificates will be provided. For printed certificates and trophy purchases, the committee will process by <u>Order Request Only (online form on Music Singapore's official website)</u>. Delivery will be made after 20th July 2025. Self Pick-Up from <u>18th to 19th July 2025</u> at partner office, Asia Music Bookstore or on 20th July 2025 at Gala Concert venue.
- 9.4 Winners will be offered the option to purchase trophies. Requests can be made via the website portal and the international shipping cost will be borne by the winner. Uncollected trophies will be destroyed after three months from the date of the gala concert.
- 9.5 Winners will be selected from each category, but judges reserve the rights to award multiple or no prize, in the event that there is more than one or no worthy winners.

Minimum Score for First Prize Winner = 90 marks and above Minimum Score for Second Prize Winner = between 85 to 89.99 marks Minimum Score for Third Prize Winner = between 80 to 84.99 marks

9.6 Virtual's first, second and third prize winners will be given a scholarship to advance to the Physical Final Round without the need to compete in the Physical Audition Round.

Winners will need to register and pay the final round fee before making arrangements to Singapore to compete.

- 12.3 Teachers / Music Studios who submitted two or more registrations selected as Prize Winners or received Honorary Mentions, will receive a Certificate of Recognition.



13. Judging

- 13.1. A panel of judges will be assigned for each category of the competition, based on their expertise.
- 13.2. Judges reserve the right to award multiple or no prizes for any of the categories in the event of more than one or no worthy winners.
- 13.3. Judges reserve the right to interrupt a performance at any time during the competition, with no impact on the scoring.
- 13.4. The juries and organiser's decisions on all matters relating to the event (including the selection of candidates, the conduct of the event and/or any resolutions made) shall be final and absolute and binding on the candidates.
